Please practise the Read, Write, Inc. sound sheet at home and continue to support reading at home with your child, completing their reading log on a weekly basis.

'Number 6 Christmas Tree' - decorate the Christmas Tree using 6 baubles. Last week we focussed on number 6, making the number in a range of ways. Ask you child to count out 6, stick them on the tree and write the numeral. We also recorded ways to make 6 (e.g. 3+3) can your child tell you any ways to make 6?

The naughty Elf kept stealing them while we were asleep! Can your child talk about how many baubles would be left if he stole 2? 3? 4? We used some inverse knowledge to solve these problems! It was tricky but we gave it a go!
