Headteacher's Notes

Dear parents and carers,

What a busy week it has been at Robins Lane – the week has flown by so we must be having fun as well as packing lots of learning into each and every day.

On Monday, we had an assembly with a difference ... It was led by Saints RLFC player Mark Percival. Mark told the children about his favourite book – Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone. Mark explained why he liked this particular book so much and the children shared their experiences of the text with him. Mark then shared an insight into his life as a St Helens rugby league player and the children asked him lots of questions about his lifestyle and how he stayed fit and healthy.

My assembly this week was all about warm-hearted kindness and acceptance. I shared an extract from one of my favourite books 'The Boy at the Back of the Class' by Onjali Q Rauf. This extract helped us, as a school community, to reflect on our actions and reactions. It reminded us of how our WINGS values are a true guide to being a responsible citizen.

On Tuesday, Year 5 enjoyed another 'Learning to Work' session. This began with a focus on money. The children learnt about outgoings and how salaries don't always cover the costs of life. They went on to play 'Lifeopoly' in groups of four. This collaborative game saw the children facing financial challenges and looking for opportunities to save money along the way – a real taste of adult life! They also investigated the pay linked to particular jobs and linked this to further education and training. An excellent session that should help children to realise the role education plays in their ability to secure jobs in the future.

This week, we have hosted two more 'Parents to School' workshop events. Our Year 6 event focused on maths. This was a challenging session and parents and carers who visited commented on the complexity of what the children were expected to do. The children were great teachers and showed the adults how they approach multi step problems in a systematic, efficient way. Year 1 also welcomed parents and carers and enjoyed sharing their phonics and learning. Thank you to Miss Welding and Miss Moremon for making this happen and thank you to all parents who supported the workshops. I am sure this experience will be useful when helping your child to complete any home learning tasks. We do hope parents and carers will continue to support by attending planned workshop events. Attendance and punctuality remain one of our key priorities. This week I am delighted to report that Mr Lownsborough's class – Year 5- achieved **100%** attendance.
