This week...

- we have absolutely LOVED 'Supertato!' I know it was a huge hit last year with Miss Cain but it has been wonderful to see how the children's learning has progressed now that they are in Reception. Children (especially boys!) have been making up their own stories, creating their own supertatoes using potatoes and materials, which has prompted lots of language and writing skills.

- we have also been accessing simple roller-skates over the past two weeks, which have been a hugely popular! This is developing a new physical skill, as well as promoting resilience and determination.

- we have been gathering information about vegetables and using this to interpret and create pictograms and tally charts.

- we have also learnt a few facts about our class artist Kadinsky and we have been creating our own versions of his famous 'Squares with Concentric Circles' piece. We've used watercolours, oil pastels and brightly coloured paper.
