Dear parents and carers,

This week, in our inspirational people assembly, we focused on the story of Bessie Coleman a woman who wanted answers as to why women were not allowed to enrol into flying schools – she was curious and, as her quest for a place continued, she became furiously curious! Bessie found an answer in France and completed her 10-month pilot's course in just seven months. In 1921, Bessie Coleman became the first African American woman in the world to receive her pilot's licence. She specialised in stunt flying, parachuting and aerial tricks. She said of herself, "I made up my mind to try. I tried and I was successful" A humble, inspirational woman whose influence lives on through the Bessie Coleman Aviators Club in Chicago.

On Monday and Tuesday, we held our first round of parents' evening. I do hope that you were able to attend to look through your children's books, discuss successes and targets moving forward. It is always a pleasure to welcome our families into school and we look forward to next half term when our traditional seasonal events will give you the opportunity to see your children perform.
